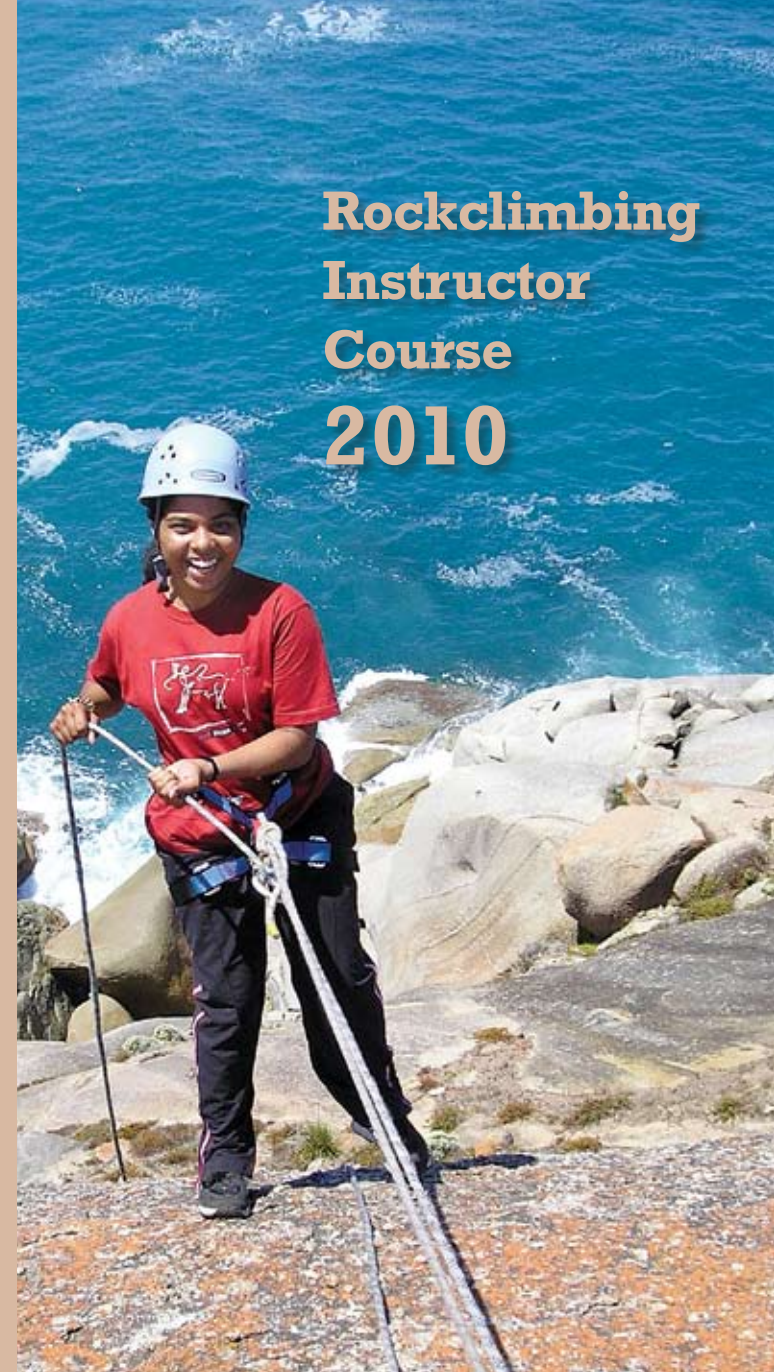

So you want to be a rockclimbing instructor?

SAREA has been serving South Australia since 1980, and was established to assist competent rockclimbers gain skills and accreditation to become guides and instructors. The SAREA rockclimbing instructor program will not teach you how to climb. You must have climbing experience before you start.

There are three levels of Instructor awards:

1. TOP ROPE GUIDE

(Restricted). An award introduced in 2009, this is for those that wish to conduct rockclimbing and abseiling activities at a specific venue only. The personal climbing demands are less, and is a Guide award only.

2. TOP ROPE INSTRUCTOR

This award is more comprehensive, and will allow the successful candidate to instruct others in a single pitch environment.

3. LEAD CLIMBING INSTRUCTOR

For those that wish to teach and guide in a multi-pitch environment. Candidates must complete Top Rope Instructor award first.

APPLICATIONS FOR TOP ROPE:

You must be competent to at least 'Assistant Instructor' standard, as outlined in the SAREA log book (available on the SAREA section of the Climbing Club of SA web page (climbingclubsouthaustralia.asn.au/sarea.html)). You must send a log book electronically to SAREA demonstrating a minimum of the following:

- > 6 months climbing experience
- > 500 metres of top rope climbing
- > Competent to climb at least grade 12
- > Competence with basic rope work, belaying and fixing anchors
- > Completed 10 abseils
- > Experience in a variety of cliff environments

*Upon submission of a log book showing additional requirements and supplementary assessment, there is an option to upgrade to Top Rope Instructor at no additional cost. Time limits apply.
